This is a drive yourself to the country day although I would suggest if you can to carpool as it just makes the driving easier if you have someone to chat to. Arrive at 11am and morning tea of scones, jam and cream will be served in good country style, thanks Kate. Bring lunch to share after we have enjoyed a stroll in the garden.

Directions: farm is called "Warranine Park" Street address is 9043 Brookton Highway (which makes it 90.43Km from the start of the Highway at Albany Highway and 79Km from Karragullen)

Just head towards Brookton (don't turn off at the Beverley turnoff). We are 20Km west (Perth side) of Brookton town - so don't let the GPS take you all the way to town (some of them do!)

The farm entrance is on the north (left) side of the road and has white fence walls with a little square building in the centre. The farm name is on the walls. I will tie balloons on the gates.

(If you reach the cross-road south to Williams/ north to York you have gone about a Km past the gate!)

Follow the drive past the sheds, through the open gate (more ballons) and up the hill to the 2nd house.

Make sure to have plenty of fuel as there are no fuel stations past Karragullen.






OPEN GARDEN – 27 October Jan Eastman's Garden in Thornlie


