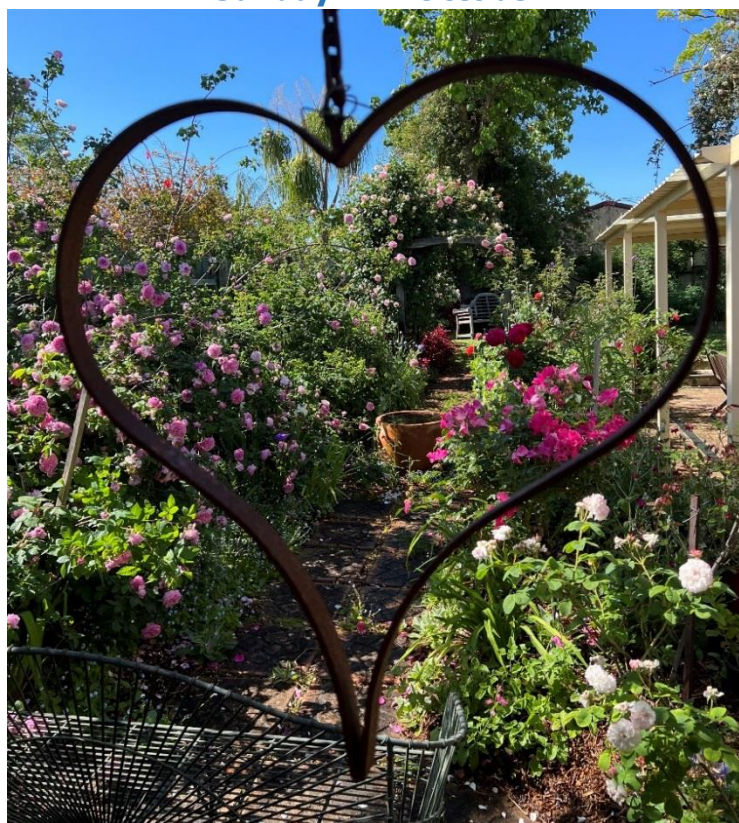

We have new nametags designed and printed by Melisa – thank you!!

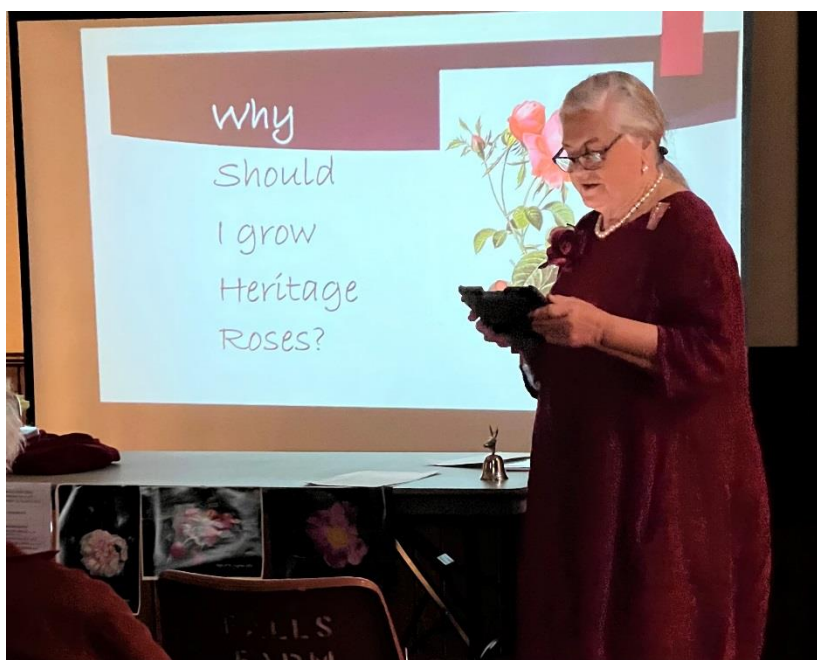
They were given to members present at the June meeting and are much improved on the previous ones.
